I finally received a response to my complaint about the appalling state of the R336 road between Maam Cross and Casla today:

"We did carry out significant restoration improvement works along 3 sections of the R340 at Glin Chath, Doire Lorraris and Loch Conaortha this year. We got the dip at Casla sorted last week. That appeared within a matter of weeks, which shows what we're dealing with in terms of trying to maintain that road which is on peat subgrade in places. Surface dressing the road is a lower cost option which seals the road surface and restores its skid resistance and maintains its lifetime for a further 5-10 years.

Digging up and starting again is not an option I'm afraid. That would be hugely costly, and might never get statutory consents given the environmental designations in the area. We're doing our best with the limited resources we have.
